

Seasonal Advice for Bonsai Enthusiasts

February (winter)

Repotting, styling and grafting all apply to this month.

Pot Temperature

When repotting your bonsai consider the factors that will affect the temperature of the soil:

- 1. Pot size
- 2. Clay vs. glazed vs. plastic
- 3. Sun exposure and length of time
- 4. Wet soil mixes
- 5. Dry soil mixes

Use of an instant read thermometer in the soil during different times of the day will provide root temperatures. Conifers have a narrower growth range 70-90 F, whereas deciduous trees have a wider range of 50-90 F. These figures are approximate based on personal observations.

Spring Soil Cleaning

If you don't repot your bonsai this year. You can still clean up the top soil. During the year, fertilizing and watering the top soil can compact and clog the soil. Remove the $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch of the surface soil and apply new soil. This will allow water to flow into the soil below.

Moss on Trunk

Look for creeping moss up the trunk, which can damage or ruin the old characteristics of the trunk. You can apply a 50/50 solution of water and vinegar and apply it to the moss. The application will cause the moss to turn brown and break apart for easy removal.

Do not brush off the dead moss that sticks to the bark. You need to use a forceps and carefully remove the moss.

On smooth bark, you can just brush off the dead moss and not worry about ruining the bark.

Moss or Algae on Deadwood

When deadwood stays wet long enough, moss or algae can start to grow. With enough time, the wood will start to rot away. This can be the task for brass wire and plastic brushes. Once the moss or algae is off, try not to water the deadwood. You can also treat the cleaned deadwood with lime sulfur.
